Stankowski Field is Site of 7th Annual Stadium Run

Temperatures well below freezing did not stop some 200+ runners/ walkers from participating in the October 7, 2000 Homecoming Stadium Run. Because of a home football game this year, the 7th annual Stadium Run changed its venue from Faurot Field to Stankowski Field, and modified its 5 K course through the MU campus. For the third consecutive year the Columbia Track Club and the University of Missouri Alumni Association have cosponsored this event benefiting the Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Boone County.

Several youngsters competed in the one-mile fun run (three laps around the track) just prior to the 5 K Run/Walk. Mayor Darwin Hindman, this event's Honorary Chair for the past three years, provided words of encouragement and recognized the assembled group for their support of the BB/BS organization. The staggered start race began promptly at 8:13:30 with perennial runner Elizabeth "Boots" Gerhardt leading out with a 16 minute 30 second head start over the "zero-time" runners.

By most measures the Run/Walk was very successful, despite the cold weather (which caused the timing equipment to malfunction, hence no finish times only places for runners) and some confusion at the final turn onto the track, which took a few runners temporarily off the course. After the race Big Brothers Big Sisters board president Troy Norton presented two gift certificates for running shoes to the top male and female finishers. The next 30 finishers received a BB/BS coffee mug. There were also token awards for the one-mile fun runners.

As the Stadium Run has grown, proceeds have increased each year, as well as money pledged by individual and corporate sponsors. This year's goal of \$6000 will be exceeded by estimated donations totaling about \$7500. 



We are going to try and post all club records, including the youth program and Colts records. 
