### Homecoming 54

Relatively warm temperatures and sunshine brought out (to Stankowski Field) some 212 runners/walkers, participating in the October 18, 2003 Homecoming 5K Run/Walk. For the past six years the University of Missouri Alumni Association and the Columbia Track Club (CTC) have co-sponsored this fund raising event, benefiting Big Brothers Big Sisters (BBBS) of Boone County. And for those who have been keeping track, 2003 marks the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this unique "staggered start" race, which has always contributed its proceeds and solicitations to the local BBBS organization. CTC's Curt Kempf was its founder and first race director. In earlier years this event was called the Stadium Run, and was first held at Faurot Field in the fall of 1994. Enough about history – here's how it went this year.

Several pre-teenagers participated in the "Tiger Cub" one-lap fun run on the track prior to the 5K Run/Walk. All received a pair of "tiny tiger" ears. Toys "R" Us gift certificates were awarded to the first boy and girl to cross the finish line. The staggered start race began at 9:00AM sharp. Our senior perennial runner, 78 year old Joe Forsee of Ashland, "led out" 11 minutes ahead of the zero-time runners. Everyone was off the course by about 10:00. The first 30 runners were given BB/BS coffee mugs at the finish line. After the race Big Brothers Big Sisters board president, Chris Bouchard presented gift certificates (for running shoes) from Tryathletics to the top male and female finishers. He thanked the organizing sponsors and all those who participated or volunteered in the Run/Walk for their support.

By most measures the 5K Run/Walk was very successful, and we anticipate exceeding this year's goal to raise \$10,000 (It is estimated that over the last ten years proceeds and donations for this event are close to \$50,000). Who Is Your Running Role Model? Who Has Influenced You Most In Running?



# Rids Romer

Once again this year the Columbia Track Club sponsored, and coached, the 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade Cross Country Team made up of C.C.S. students. The P.A.L.S. group included 9 teams in the girls and boys divisions this year. This program has grown greatly over the four years we have participated, and our teams have done wonders again this year. A grade school cross country race is 1.5 miles whereas the high school cross country race is 3.1 miles and quite a challenge.

This year the team included:

8th graders: Amanda Archer, Melea Shimkus, Chris Boeckmann, Andy Bietsch, and Ben Keown.

7<sup>th</sup> graders: Kaitlin Vogt, and Allen Greenlief.

6<sup>th</sup> graders: Bevin Gunn, Monique White, Christian Hock, and Evan King

4<sup>th</sup> grade: Danica Shimkus 3<sup>rd</sup> grade: Nathan Keown

Thus our average grade level was 6.5 . We allowed all interested athletes to run regardless of grade. While this makes it more difficult to win, it is in keeping with the spirit of the sport which allows all willing runners to compete.

Each meet awarded medals to the top ten finishers, and our team won 19 medals in five meets (2 first place, 5 second place, 4 third place, 1 forth place, 2 fifth place, 4 sixth place, and 1 tenth place). The average race time of the team went from 14:03 at the first meet on an easy course to 11:29 on the last and most difficult course. This time decrease is an improvement of 2:34 per 1.5 mile throughout the season, and that is an incredible improvement! For the championship meet both the boys and girls teams came in second place. That is exceptional considering the overall age of the athletes on the team. The experience the younger members have gotten will be invaluable for the years to come.

We look forward to extending the opportunity for all interested runners again next year to take the challenge of cross country running. Our past CTC team members have from 2000 to the present become: the top four varsity girls for Hickman High School, the top varsity boy for Rock Bridge, two varsity girls for Helias, and two varsity boys for Hickman.
