Temp. 67 F. at the start of the hilly out and back race. Thirteen would-be prevaricators took a shot at the traveling trophy, first won in 1970. Patty Ferguson took off first with a designated time of 62 minutes. Alan Benjamin who sandwiched the race into a long training run was last off the line with a designated time of 45:30. The way it should work, theoretically, is that people predict their race times accurately and everyone would finish together around the same actual time. However, this race stimulates inflated predicted times, read slower than ability would indicate times, so the slowest predicted time leaves the start line first, and the fastest predicted time leaves last. The first runner across the finish line wins the Great Sandbagger Trophy. Such an eventuality means that the winner gets to put his or her name on the trophy, adds some bauble or feature to the trophy, and must insure that the trophy appears at the race the following year. Oscar Chavez won having run 10.5 minutes faster than predicted. The fastest real time was turned in by Harvey James in 44:05, but he finished 5th. Special thanks goes to Anne Hessler for timing and to Julia and Alex Chavez for help at the finish line.

August 19, 1980 Great Sandbagger 10,000 Meter Run: Jim Gibson, Sr. in a rare competitive race-walking experience (occasioned because of his all-consuming desire to win the "monster") was first across the finish line. Fast time of the day was turned in by Dennis Hinkamp, 34:51, then Bob Goodrich, 35:35, Dick Hessler 35:36 and 45 others. It was related how the Hessler family gave up the "trophy" by injuring themselves (Dick sliced his thumb with a bow saw and Peter cut his foot with a pair of scissors) and, further, how they had to build an addition to their house to escape the curse of the monster. The monster is still with us, having been given tender, loving care by the most recent recipient, Kevin Crane.

PERSONAL RECORDS:

While pondering the answer to the question of personal records, I looked through some profiles of other members. Now the question is, "what am I doing with the likes of Tom & Linda LaFontaine and Joe Duncan, not to mention the CTC Board of Directors?" My personal records are not even worth mentioning. Except for this one, I haven't smoked a cigarette since April 20, 2004. Now that is a record.

WHEN DID YOU START RUNNING?

I started running as a kid on the streets of Breckenridge, MO. I was the second fastest kid in town at the street fair. In my freshman year of High School they started a track club. There were four of us on the team. We ran a relay team. After school we would get dressed out and run the half mile to the track as fast as we could so we could get a cigarette in before the Coach got there. I never ran much after that until about 3 years ago. I probably have the newest knees in the club. I started running for my cholesterol and high blood pressure. When I got to 3 miles I had too much lung pain to let it go. I asked the doctor. It was emphysema.

When I finally stopped smoking, I shaved my head and donated my hair to Locks of Love. I had 15 inches of hair to donate. I said that I would not let my hair grow back until I crossed the finish line at the Boston Marathon. I didn't know what I was saying. I didn't know you had to qualify. By my first anniversary, I realized that I may not get that fast and made a plan B. I can let my hair grow back after I run from where I started smoking to where I stopped. That's 140 miles. Wish me luck.

WEEKLY MILEAGE/FAVORITE WORKOUT: I've been running on my own for the most part lately. Something I read. One weekend I run a 10 mile Saturday, and then a 14 mile journey on Sunday. The next weekend I don't run on one day and try to run 30 miles on the other day. I have succeeded at 29 miles. During the week I get two or three 4 mile lunches. I did manage to get my first black toenail.

News from the Shelton family:

Amina Shelton, 12, won her 4th National Championship medal by placing 5th in the 11-12 age group long jump at the USATF National Youth Outdoor Track and Field Championships held June 30th in Knoxville, Tennessee. Amina recorded her 3rd best jump ever, going 14' 4". Her best jump came during the second week of this years CTC Summer Youth meets when she jumped an over-all female meet record of 15' 1". She now has won two bronze and two 5th place medals in national championship meets.

Derek Shelton made it an unprecedented 10-for-10 golds to remain undefeated in the long jump at this year's Show-Me State Games with a jump of 16 feet, 1 inch to win the 45-49 age group. In 20 events since 1995, he has won 19 Gold's and 1 Silver in the long, high and triple jumps in Show-Me State Games competition. He also holds the SMSG records for the 30-39 and 40-44 age groups in the long jump with a distance of 21 feet, 4 inches in both divisions.

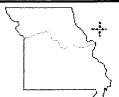
