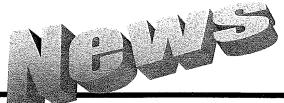

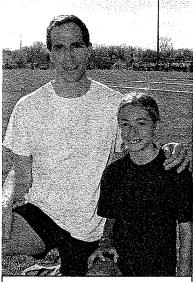

Looking Back

April 5, 1980: Jim Gibson and Leonard Busen had a dual competition in the Walk-Run Pentathlon, with Jim prevailing 1256 points to 648. Busen won the 2-mile walk 18:18 to 18:53 and the mile walk 8:29 to 9:10. But the kid won all the running events: 880: 2:35 to 3:10, 2-mile run: 12:35 to 15:15 and 220: 28.6 to 36.7.

At the same time 32 runners had the 3, 2, 1 triathlon: Jeff Mittelhauser was 14:59, 9:54 & 4:43 winning over Dennis Hinkamp's 16:20, 10:22, 4:48. Tom LaFontaine was 16:10, 10:32 & 5:05, Ben Londeree, age 45, 16:22, 10:35 & 5:01, Dick Hessler 16:22, 10:36 & 5:11. Martha Stinson led the distaff side with 17:45, 11:45 & 5:42.

Then in the afternoon we had a One-Hour Walk: Jerry Young had 7 miles, 1096 yards to Randy Mimm's 7-559. Busen was back on the track after his morning efforts and walked 6-353. Rob Spier had 5-749 and Amy Hessier 4-1708.

5K Run or 5K/2.5K Walk-A-Thon PROJECT SUDAN – Giving a Harvest of Hope to Morobo, Sudan (Goal \$20,000) Pleasant Grove Methodist Church, Hatton, MO May 21, 2005

Registration begins at 8 a.m. with the run beginning at 8:30 a.m. Registration fee is \$20. Walkathon registration begins at 9:30, and the walk begins at 10 am. Those who wish to bring in a donation sheet and donations of \$50 or more will receive a refund of their registration fee if they so desire. Free T-Shirt to those who register by the May 11 early registration deadline. Each participant in the run will be entered in prize drawings which begin at 11:30 a.m. Late registration is available on the day of the race. No fee for children 10 and under.

Course: The run course is 2.5 K blacktop and 2.5K gravel with some hills in a beautiful rural setting. The roads will be monitored for traffic control. A shuttle will be provided at the farthest point for those who may need assistance. Run begins at Hatton Church – Start line will begin @ 1/10 mile north on the gravel road. Runners and walkers will go north on gravel road to Route M, South on Route M to Route E, east on Route E to church – 5 K will be two laps on this course.

Olympian at Columbia Catholic School

Fourth and fifth grade PE classes at Columbia Catholic School had a special visitor April 20, 2005. Derrick Peterson, former MU runner and current US Olympian, led the 4th and 5th graders in a mini track camp. He showed the kids a video of himself qualifying at the Olympic Trials and then running in the Athens Olympics where he finished 4th in his heat. He did not make the elite 16 in the 800 meter run, but he did earn the applause of the CCS kids. Derrick led the kids in stretches and then cheered them on in a mega-relay race out on the track. Derrick was patient enough to give lots of autographs, and even KOMU was on hand to document the day. The kids were so impressed that an athlete of this caliber was interested in helping them as they prepare for their mile run.

CMC KIDZ (ages 6-12) and CMC TEENZ (ages 13-19) are the junior divisions of Columbia Multisport Club, designed to promote swimming, biking, and running and to encourage goal-oriented exercise among the youth of our community. Through the experience and support of Columbia Multisport Club members, we will improve the knowledge and desire of the "next generation" of recreational and elite multisport athletes.
