Mimm got his team in front at the end of the first mile and with Stewart on the run, that team got no argument for first place. There was quite a battle for 2nd, however. Hirt had 26 seconds over Schrik at the end of mile 1, then Lewis came back to get within two seconds of Hinckley, then Hirt moved the margin up to 16 seconds at the halfway point. Again, Lewis brought his team to within two seconds -- Hirt moved out again to give Hinckley a 19 sec. lead going into the last mile. Lewis cut the margin by 12 seconds, but ran out of laps. Leuthold-Storvick set a record for Age 40 & over while the two Hessler kids get one for Age 15 & under--one which they can try to better each year for the next 7 years.
