AND, NOW A LOOK AT THE PRESENT DAY HEROES:

CTC had three runners in the Drake Relays Marathon on April 28. DICK MARTIN got under three hours for the first time, at age 46, with a time of 2:59:32. He finished 85th out of some 700 runners. JACK WALLACE was not too far behind Dick as he was just over the three hour mark with 3:00:30 and then DON JOHNSON, at age 50, was within two minutes of a PB with 3:24+. The weather was perfect, in the 40°s, cloudy, some drizzle. The course is basically a rolling course, with only two hills of any consequence.

JON HERBERT had abusy, and successful, menth of running in Rpril. First he was first place finisher in the Ft. Wood Half-Marathen en April 14th with a time of 1:13:00. A week later he was 5th in the Kansas Relays Marathen in 2:37+. On the 29th he wen the Wilson's Creek 10,000 Meter Run (which was aderned with the presence of Walt Stack) at Springfield with a time of 33:29 (a course record, on a very hillyccourse). Then he "jogged" a two mile at Briggs Stadium in 10:02 to win the age 25-29 award. Jon's son, Ryun, ran the two mile for the first time with a 17:14 effort, proudly wearinghis CTC shirt.

MIKE FIELDS ran the Penn State Relays marathon in 3:18:19, the same as he had done in the New York race. Mike Bid the Penn race on a rather modest base of preparation. A hip injury had held him to 30/ week until the 6 weeks prior to the marathon when he was able to get up to 48 miles a week. Up to 19 miles, Mike was at a sub 3:10 pace, but the last 6 miles did him in. Even so, he finished 165th out of 1180 finishers.

WESLEY PAUL and his Dad, AILO, have returned from another trip to Taiwan. Once again it was a grand occasion for the fanners of Taiwan. Wesley had eight races in 12 days, doing well in all of them except for the last one when he was sick. A total of some 10,000 runners were in the races with the largest attracting 4800 runners through the streets of Taipei. Nowsley had an interview with the President, Mr. Chiang, who gave Wesley two baskets of bananas, knowing that Wesley Riked them. Maybe that's why Wesley got sick. Anyway, this interview and the President's remark, "Today we run for national unity, temorrow we shall run for national recovery," made all the headlines in the next day's papers. There is a possibility that some runners/will come here for a visit (and some racing) this summer and there is even a possibility that some CTC runners will be invited to visit Taiwan. Running is just now beginning to boom in Taiwan and they find it amazing that we have several 40 year olds who can run two miles in less thanneleven minutes.

CONGRATULATIONS TO AMY JOHNS for winning the State High School One Mile Championship in a very exciting and emotional race. Amy won the race in the last yard from Cathy Corpeny of Kansas City Southwest, the pre-race favorite. In fact, Amy was picked to finish no beter than 4th or so even though she is a national class marathoner. It seems, there was some doubt as to her speed since her previous best mile time was 5:17. As was expected, Amy took the lead and worked it up to over 15 yards at the 880 mark. Corpeny began closing and caught Amy with 220 to go and went on by. But coming off the curve, Amy regained the lead, only to lose it again on the straightaway. In most mile races, most obsevers would think that would be it, but Amy fooled everybody with a furious charge, unleashing some speed that had never been shown before to edge in front just before the tape. Her time? 5:03.1, a PB by 14 seconds.

THE AMERICAN CENTURION CLUB gained two new members from the 100 mile walk put on by the San Diego Track Club (Paul Hendricks, race director) on May 12 & 13. The race also included a 100 mile run and was held on the San Diego State U. track. The problem was that Paul picked the hottest weekend of the year for his race--100+ degrees both days. These horrible conditions obviously allowed for very few finishers out of the 26 starters, 19 runners and 7 walkers. In fact, there were only four finishers, two runners (Bob King with 18:50:37 and T. J. Key with 20:55:23) and two walkers, Daws Hugener, who becomes Centurion #26 and Doug Reeves who is Centurion #27. Hugener is age 41, while Reeves becomes the youngest person who has ever become an American Centurion, at age 23. Augie Hirt, at age 25, was the previous youngest.

AMY JOHNS followed up her State One Mile Championship by running a sparkling 36:01.5 10,000 meter on Hickman Track in the 10,000 meter run for women. Also in the race were Jane Kernell and Debbie Hoxworth but I have no times for them. Anyway, the big story is that Amy's remarkable performance was under the 36:15 qualifying standard for the Senior AAU Outdoor T & F Championships to be held in Walnut, Calif. June 14-16. Amy intends to be there. Her mile splits in the qualifying run were 5:34, 11:20 (a PB for 2 miles), 17:11, 23:04, 29:00 and 34:49, and, of course, all those latter splits were also PB's for those distances.

JOE MARKS is coordinating travel to Kansas City for the Hospital Hill Run on June 9 (although, I suppose everyone is going up the day before). If you need a ride, or if you have room in your car and are willing to take some passengars, thencall Joe at 445-1919. Joe also has the new CTC t-shirts and singlets.
