Kind of a bad day for a long race--quite humid, high 60's, some wind, but cloudy. Notice how many dropouts there were and how the times deteriorated as the race progressed. However, Steve Fisher set a record--by a mere 4 seconds--beating the old mark set by Doug Clark and Jeff Roth in 1978. Jon Herbert beat Dick Hessler's 30-39 mark of 1:46:37 set 5 years ago while Wesley Paul not only beat his own mark of 2:10:09 (at age 8!), he set an American record for age 11 for 30 kilo. In addition he set CTC marks for 5 kilo (going out fast as usual), beating his own 17:57, and 20 kilo, beating a 1:22:02 he had as an 8 year old.

#### NEW AWARDS FOR CTC MEMBERS

A new set of awards, which may be called the "Better Than Last Year's Achievement Awards," will be presented at the 1981 Annual Meeting. The idea is to recognize members who achieve significant improvement in their own running ability without regard to how they compare to anyone else. Each winner will receive a trophy with the inscription "Achievement Award 1981" and the runner's name. Every CTC member can win by improving his or her finish times over last season's in any 3 of the 4 events or alternates below.

- 1. Mile Run, Becenter 29, 1980 (20 K Run, January 17, 1981)

AND NOW A LOOK AT TODAY'S HEROES (AND HEROINES):

JEFF MITTELHAUSER and MILENE HOLLON have turned in some good performances in a few races. First, they were in a five mile race (called The Human Race) in Kirksville on Nov. 15. Jeff finished 2nd with 25:06 behind Ken Garrett's 24:31, while Milene was first female with 29:48. Jeff says that the course was obviously short, so I guess he doubts his ability to run 5 5:00 miles, or does he doubt Milene's ability to run 5 6:00 miles? Then on Nove. 22 Jeff and Milene teamed up in the Turkey Twosome at Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City finishing 4th as a team in the six mile race. Milene was in at 38:11 and Jeff at 30:28. Herb Mittelhauser had 39:57 and Julie 40:45.

Then Milene was first female in the Jappy Dickson Turkey Day Race in Quincy, Ill., a 6 mile event, with a time of 38:00.

JOHN WESTON, JOHN HEMPHILL AND JOE MARKS were in the Alton, Ill. 10 mile Mississippi River run on Nov. 29 and I believe they all got a 10 mile PB on the fast, fast course. Out of almost 600 runners Weston was 15th in 53:47, Hemphill 43rd in 57:30 and Marks 65th with 59:03 (3rd in the 40-49 group).

JIM BREITENBUCHER has moved to Alamosa, Iowa (he is NOT in the Iowa State Men's Reformatory there) and has been doing quite a bit of racing (running, not walking). He's had a 10,000 meter time of 33:31, a 7 miler in 38:35 (The Bix 7 miler, Davenport, Iowa, 2,000 runners, including Bill Rodgers who won in 33:58), a hlaf marathon in 1:14:42, a 15 mile in 1:30:52 and 60th place in the America's Marathon in Chicago with 2:42:35, a PB by over 7 minutes.

LOYD RHIDDLEHOOVER, President of Kemper Military, was the winner of the age 50 group in that Mexico YMCA 10,000 meter run on Oct. 26, the race in which Don Johnson was 2nd. Loyd had 40:33. Previous to that he had finished first in the age 50 category in the JC Penney "Breathe Easy" 10K run at Johnson County Community College, Kansas. That was on Oct. 13 and Loyd's time in that was 40:13.

DON and MARGARET JOHNSON celebrated their 25th wedding anniversary by a trip to Hawaii where they both intended to run the Honolulu Marathon on Dec. 6. Don did run the marathon with a time of 3:31:00, but Margaret had to watch because she had sprained her ankle a week earlier. At least that is the story. We suspect, however, that was simply a ploy to con Don into another trip to Hawaii.

RANDY MIMM, who has moved back home to New Jersey, had one of his better races—a 3rd place finish in the National AC 40 kilo walk in Long Branch, NJ on Nov. 3rd. Randy had a time of 3:33:24 finishing behind Dan O'Connor at 3:24:21 and Ray Sharp at 3:28:40. 42 walkers started that race.

NATIONAL TITLES TO HENDRICKS, O'CONNOR

The first weekend in November saw two National Athletics Congress race-walking titles decided. In San Deigo, Paul Hendricks not only hosted the 100 mile championship, he walked off with the title in American record time-18:49:52. On the other side of the country--Long Branch, New Jersey, to be exact--Dan 0°Connor withstood a strong challenge from Ray Sharp to take the 40 Km race in 3:24:21.

Hendricks, coming back from semi-retirement following last year's 100 miler in Columbia, was unphased by hot weather (high 80's at the start) and the presence of Allen Price, known for his fast early pace. Paul went out faster than even Allen cares to travel, hitting 5 miles in 44:59 and 10 in 1:31:18. Price was only 2:21 back at that point, but the lead grew quickly from there and Hendricks was never seriously challenged.

The real surprise in the race was Jonathan Rem, walking for only 9 months. Starting slowly, he passed Price just before 25 miles. At that point, he was 29 minutes behind Hendricks, still blazing along with a 4:00:26. The lead grew only slightly over the next 25 miles, with Paul going through 50 in 8:18:30:12 and Rem in 9:06:40. Price had 9:32:52 and was being challenged by the tough veteran, Leonard Busen, just 5 minutes back.

Rem started to close on Hendricks, feeling the effects of his fast 'early pace, and closed the gap to less than 21 minutes by 80 miles. Price was now an isolated third, with Bave Hugener having passed Busen. Rem then ran into difficulties of his own, losing about 12 minutes over the next 10 miles before coming on again to get the final margin down to a half hour. Rem's time has been bettered only by Hendricks and Price among U.S. walkers. (Note: Larry Young walked 18:07:12 in 1971 on a 220-yard indoor track when floodlike conditions hit Columbia. Not being on a quarter—mile track, it is not recognized as a record, but is obviously a more significant accomplishment than the recognized performances.) Hugener had no trouble holding off Busen for fourth with Dale Sutton, Robert Marshall, and Elsie McCarvey also going the distance. It was the second time for Elsie and she remains the only female U.S. Centurion. Rem, Sutton, and Marshall joined the Centurion ranks. It was number eight for Busen, moving him ahead of Chuck Hunter, and number six for Price. More significantly, it was Allen's third 100-miler in less than 4 months, with a 100 and a 75 Km race in the same period. Hendricks finished his third 100 miler, improving his best time from 19:10:37 and Hugener did his second.


