MARK HOFIUS AND DEBBIE HOXWORTH ARE WINNERS AGAIN Diet-Pepsi 10,000 meter race April 27, 1980:

An easier course and cool weather sure make a difference. I think every runner who ran both the Human Race and the Diet-Pepsi race improved their times by quite a bit in the latter race. Temperature at the 8:30 AM start for the Diet-Pepsi race was in the upper 40's and the sun was not a factor. There was some wind, though from the north, but overall the conditions for a race were excellent. The Diet-Pepsi course is devoid of the monster hills that mark the Human Race course. Actually the variety one gets in running both courses is desirable—it is good to have a challenging, tough course and then one which is easier. Anyway, times were consistently faster. Mark Hofius was 55 seconds faster and Debbie was 2:05 faster. Here are some other differences: Shegoski 2:10 faster, McMullen :26, Londeree :41 (and a PB!), Hessler 1:27, Hemphill :59, Maxey :40, Palks :50 (this was Jon's last CTC race—he has moved to Wichita and a job with the VA Hospital), Hellie 1:20, Pastoret 2:39, Bellows :37, Lewis 1:37, Marks 1:40, Koonse 1:17, Jim Gibson 2:06, etc., etc., you get the idea.

While this race was not a scheduled CTC race, still since it was essentially one of "our" races, it will count insofar as CTC event records are concerned. Therefore, the following records fell: Randy Starr lowered the age 15 & under 10,000 meter road mark set by Wesley Paul in July, 1979. Starr had 37:04 while Wesley had 37:12, which was enroute to 15 K. In July '76 Ron Tabb was 30:48 enroute to his 15 K, so Hofius beat that. Then Ben Londeree got under Walt Renaud's 34:44. It is amazing that Ben gets a PB at age 45, especially when you keep in mind that his times over the years are really exceptional. He is in as good shape as he has ever been in. Don Johnson was six seconds off Turk's record, while Amy Johns' 38:00 wasn't threatened nor was Jim Zickefoose's 32:36 for 30-39.

We are very appreciative of the role of the Pepsi Cola Company for sponsoring this race. Special kudos to Pepsi's RON LAVINDER for the many hours of work he put into the event and to NEAL PETERSON of BHN Advertising who masterminded the promotional efforts and who, on race day, did most/the typing of the results. Ron Lavinder recruited some 15 Pepsi employees to help. THANKS also to Ben Londeree for getting the course certified, to Dr. Leland Pfefer who acted as race physician and to the followein other CTC people who assisted in the conduct of the race. Jim Walter, Vonn Walter, Jim Gibson, Joann Gibson, Matt Gibson, Steve Gibson, Tom LaFantaine, Annette LaFontaine, Russ Kurth, Joyce Schulte, Carl Schulte, Dennis Schulte, Marin Blevins and Ben Welch. Then THANKS to Robin Lingle for all the equipment he loaned and for opening up the UMC facilities, and to the Columbia Police Reserves headed by Harry Gowan.

We were fairly satisified with the finish line administration of the race. This was the first time we had used the "pull tag" system and there is nothing like the first time to learn what all can go wrong. There are errors in the results for 25-30 runners in the early-mid 300's. Probably this came about because of reversing some of the tags. We didn't post immediate results after the race, because of uncertainties, but next time we will. And, I apologize to the poor runner who came to the chutes, found them all closed, ducked under and into one of them, only to find that the other end was also closed, since he got into an aisle instead of a chute, He must really have felt trapped. This happened when Duncan closed a chute just a little before another got open. So, we do learn. I wonder if he is still in there?

Very humid morning. Fog just lifted at the start. Temp. in 60s. Some tight battles with Tom L. lookin' smooth as he cruised to first place in all three events. Matt Gibson had PBs in all three events. Brother Tim had one—in the 400—as he blasted by Joe Marks who was heard to mutter something about slow twitch and old age. Probably the toughest match of the morning was between Dick Moe and Don Lewis. Check those times!

And MANY THANKS! to Joe Marks for being Race Director for this affair.

We know how five of the Columbia people did in the Regional Diet Pepsi race in St. Louis on May 18. JEAN GRIFFIN placed second in the female over 50 group with 51+, a couple of minutes behind her age group winner. SUSAN BOYLE was third in female 36-49 with around 41:00. BEN LONDEREE was only a couple of seconds off a PB for 10,000 meters with 34:41 to place 4th in the male 36-49. DON JOHNSON was 5th, male 50 & over with 40:20 while MARK HOFIUS was 10th or so overall, but I have no time. Nor have I heard how Debbie Hoxworth did. There were over 2,000 runners in this race, running over almost a perfectly level course, sarting and ending at Kingshighway and Lindell. Temperature was good, but it was humid. The race was won by Bill Rodgers, by a slim margin, indicating that he was probably not extending himself. The organization of the race was excellent and the Columbia people were very appreciative for the kindnesses given them at the reception the evening before by the Pepsi people.

JON HERBERT finished second in the Kansas Relays marathon in 2:32:25, some 5½ minutes behind the winner, Tony Conroy. Jon included in his preparations some fine running in a couple of Springfield races. In a 20 kilo race he was first at 1:06:14 ahead of Dan Dwyer at 1:09:38 and Denton Childs at 1:09:39. Then in a 10 kilo race, Dwyer evened the score with a winning 31:44 with Jon at 32:10. Jon's son, Ryun, was the age 9 & under winner with 61:25.

Speaking of DENTON CHILDS, he won the Hogeye Marathon (I guess that was run someplace in Arkansas) with a time of 2:32+ on a hilly course.

The 1980 MVAAU Track & Field Guides are now available. However, MVAAU is unable to give free distribution this year. On an individual basis the booklets sell for \$1.50, however, CTC can get them for \$1.00 for a mass purchase. On June 15 we will order some of the booklets at \$1.00 each. If you want one of them then it will cost you a dollar and you should send your dollar to Joe Duncan before June 15. After June 15 you can order them from MVAAU 4422 Belleview Kansas City, Mo. 64111, but it will cost you \$1.50.

Ken Young, founder o the National Running Data Jenter, has done a countless array of statistical projects. Among them are various age handicap systems. Don Johnson came across the 15 kilo handicap tables recently and did some interesting comparisons with some of the 15 kilo results of our July, 1979 race. Here is the 15 K table and the comparisons Don selected. Not surprisingly, Wesley Paul is by far the best after application of his 21 minute handicap. He beats Steve Fisher, the runner-up by almost 10 minutes! We don't know that any of this proves anything but it is of interest.

THE UNIQUENESS OF THE AGE HANDICAP SYSTEM

The age handicap is a unique approach to racing. The handicap system offers all runners the same opportunity to win. Entrants will start the race at different times, giving younger and the older runners an advantage over those in their prime racing years. The result creates an exciting start and a challenge throughout the entire race. The tables below list the handicap by age and sex. They were first developed by Ken Young in 1977, and have been modified each year.

And this leads to some general touting of the amazing amount of material put out by Ken Young and Bob Martin on behalf of the NRDC. Following is some idea of what is available from them:

Four New NRDC Books for 1980

The NRDC is pleased to announce publication of four new and improved annual books to be available in the first part of 1980. This year the books will be both compiled and distributed by the NRDC. We believe this will result in better quality control, and it will enable us to include more data. In order of release, the books are:

NRDC books:

Certified Road Running Courses lists over 850 road running courses certified by the National Standards Committee. A printing delay has enabled us to include all of the courses ever certified through mid- April, 1980. This compares with the 437 courses listed in last year's book. The location, date of measurement, and type of course are shown. Necessary to choose races in which you can qualify for national records and rankings.

Running Records by Age shows the single-age records for both men and women in 25 track and road running events. Improvements from last year include the complete track records for both men and women of all ages and the listing of both the official mark and the best pending mark if it is better. Lists best mark on a point-to-point course if it betters the official record. Includes official age-group records. Records as of 1 Jan 80.

- U. S. Distance Rankings is more than double the size of last year's book. That is because it includes the first-time compilation of in-depth all-time rankings, as well as rankings for 1979. In each event, it lists the top 100 men and top 50 women, as well as up to 10 in each age group. The number of age groups are increased, too. The all-time rankings and the 1979 rankings are listed to the same depth. Includes list of races used in book.
- U. S. Marathoners will be the largest listing of U. S. runners performances ever made. It will rank well over 100,000 individual marathon marks. Every marathon performance in 1979 on a certified course that was reported to the NRDC is included. Since the vast majority of marathons are run on certified courses, the majority of marathoners will find each of their marks ranked in this book. Runners can determine their rank on a national basis and within their age group. The book contains a wealth of summary tables, providing hours of interesting reading for the marathon buff. The format and printing will be improved, with book form rather than newspaper style being used.

Books will be shipped as they are completed.

All-time Road Running Rankings

The first-time compilation of all-time road running rankings is prepared on the basis of best marks. These rankings will appear in the 1980 edition of the NRDC book "U. S. Distance Rankings". The all-time rankings are shown to the same depth as the annual rankings for 1979 shown in this book. While the annual rankings show the best mark for each runner, a single runner could theoretically fill an entire list in the all-time rankings.

Some highlights from the 15k and 20k all-time rankings, first off the computer and being readied for printing in the book: the 100th best men's 15k mark is 47:15, while the 50th best for the women is 58:40. Wesley Paul leads three age groups. 7 and under, 8 and 9, and 10 and 11, with a best time of 56:15. Hal Higdon has five of the top ten marks in the 45-49 group. he also leads the 40-44 division. Ed Almeida has the top two times at 55-59, while George Sheehan has four of the top ten. third best time for girls 8 and 9 is 1:13:18... a time of 1:55:59 ranks Marion Epstein fifth for women 60 and over. Randy Thomas and Mike Slack own the two 20k marks under an hour. the 50th best is 1:03:26 and 100th is 1:04:30...50th best for women is 1:21:45...31 of the top 50 women's marks were made in 1979. Wesley Paul leads the two youngest age groups at 20k. Paul Noreen has four of the top ten marks in age 40-44. Alex Ratelle owns the top three in age 50-54. only seven over-70 marks at 20k have been recorded, ranging from 1:36:45 by Ray Sears to 2:45:51 recorded by Henry Bent. Lora Cartwright leads the girls 12 and 13 with 1:22:16 and ranks third for girls 14 and 15 with 1:25:24. Ruth Anderson has three of the top five age 45-49 times. just two marks are recorded for women 60 and over. Miki Gorman and Trudy Rapp are 40+ women that make the top-50 open list.

Dramatic Improvement in Marks for 10k, 20k

The 1980 edition of "U. S. Distance Rankings", now going to the printer, brings out the great improvement in road running marks in the last year. Taking the 10k and 20k road distances as examples, the marked improvement is evident both at the top and in the depth of the rankings. Comparing equivalent rankings for the two years 1978 and 1979, the 1979 mark is better in almost every case. Thus, it takes a faster run to make the rankings list. Some examples, using the open division and comparable adult age groups, the time at the bottom of the list compares as follows: (another position on list used in some cases)

Comparison of marks in other age groups would show the same general trend. Some comparisons are more difficult because there aren't enough marks to fill out all the available spots in the rankings. However the number of marks in the higher age groups is increasing. For men 70+ at 10k, there were just seven marks reported in 1978, while in 1979 the tenth place was 55:46.

Who Holds the Most Single-Age Running Records?

That question came up as the computer sheets were being put in final form for the 1980 edition of "Running Records by Age", which has now gone to the printer. While the NRDC computer system can do things that even amaze us sometimes, it's not set up to give us the leaders in number of age records. The 1980 edition of this book lists records for both men and women of all ages in 14 track events from 100 meters to 100 miles and 24 hours, and in 13 road events from 10 kilometers to 100 miles.

Would the leader be Hal Higdon, who holds a variety of records in both track and road running over a long period of years? Could it be Irene Obera, who holds 12 age records in the 200 meters alone? How about oldsters Paul Spangler or Harold Chapson, who holds a string of eight consecutive age records in the 1500 meters? Then there's Marion Epstein, who once held the most road running age records. Or could it be a youngster like Steve Parsons, who holds more age one records than anybody? One thing we're pretty sure of -- it's not likely to be a top open division runner, like Bill Rodgers, Frank Shorter, or Joan Benoit.

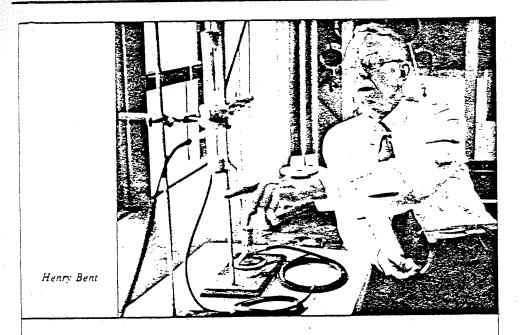

Bent named Jefferson Award recipient

Henry E. Bent, former graduate dean and professor emeritus of chemistry at UMC, has been selected the 1980 recipient of the UM system's annual Thomas Jefferson Award.

Although retired. Dr. Bent is still active in University and civic affairs. He joined the UMC faculty in 1936, was dean of the graduate school from 1938 until 1966 and was named professor emeritus in 1971.

Dr. Bent will receive a monetary award derived from interest accrued from a \$10,000 gift by the Robert Earll (cq) McConnell Foundation, and a citation which will be presented in a campus ceremony next month.

The selection was made by a system committee from nominees submitted from the four campuses. The award is made to that member of the University community who best exemplifies the principles and ideals of Jefferson. This year's selection was announced by UM President James C. Olson at the March 28 Board of Curators meeting in Kansas City.

"Henry Bent's actions in his department, as dean of the Graduate School, and elsewhere have always indicated a respect for diverse opinion and an abiding faith in the democratic process, both characteristics of Thomas Jefferson." states the chemistry department's nomination statement.

"Both men have held very dear the concept and ideal of public education and the state university—Jefferson in establishing the University of Virginia and Henry Bent as graduate dean for

28 years, striving constantly to upgrade the quality of research and graduate education in the first state university of Jefferson's Louisiana Purchase, and throughout the nation," the statement says.

The award recipient is a 1922 graduate of Oberlin College. He received an M.S. degree at Northwestern University in 1923 and a Ph. D. degree from the University of California, Berkeley, in 1926. He was on the chemistry faculty at Harvard from 1926 to 1936, before coming to Missouri.

Dr. Bent has been instrumental in helping many young graduate students and staff launch successful research programs, and is credited for providing summer research opportunities at UMC. He also is known for his zeal and ingenuity in teaching large general chemistry classes and in devising special equipment for demonstrating the phenomena and principles taught.

He has had more than 50 scientific articles published in refereed journals, has written numerous other articles on various academic subjects and was editor of the Association of American Universities proceedings.

For many years he was councilor of the American Chemical Society and served on various society committees. He also is a member of Sigma Xi and Phi Beta Kappa. Last year he was a delegate to the White House Conference on Libraries, and has served as chairman of the resolutions committee for the Governor's Conference on Libraries.

Mat is not mentioned about Lean Henry Bent in this article is how, at age 75, he began a career in race-walking. He holds a few over age 70 walking records (American records) and his battles with "the kid," Milliam Taft, were the highlight of many walking races. Perhaps Dean Bent's most butstanding achievement was his completion of 50 miles of walking in less than 12 hours in the 1978 100 mile walk-at age 771 Dean Bent hasn't competed for several months now, but still gets in a long walk almost every His doctor has day. advised him not to subject himself to the stress of competition -perhaps the doctor knows how badly Dean Bent likes to stay close to the "kid."

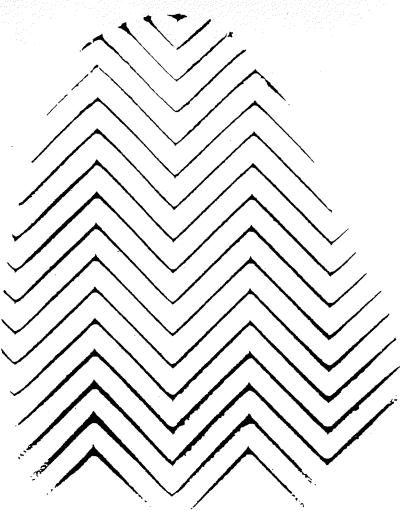

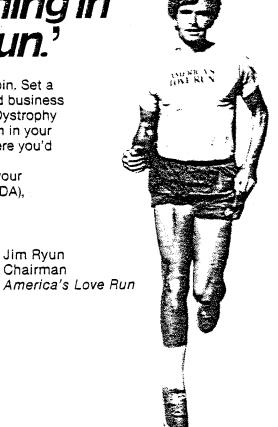

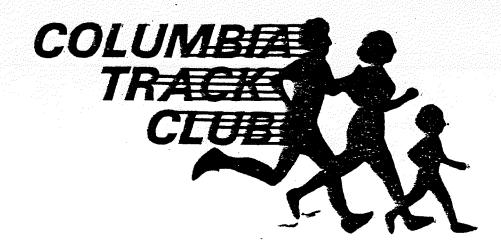
