As has happened before an injured runner strode into this Sandbagger affair allowing as to how he was going to test himself with a light workout and then proceeded to be the first across the finish line. So it was with Joe Kurth who went for many months without running because of a knee problem. For the past few weeks he has been coming back and, of course, will eventually be much faster over 10k than his 48:10 in this race. But 48:10 was all he needed to become the proud owner of the Sandbagger montrosity. After having the trophy for two different years, the Gibson family (at Joanne's insistence) left town this year to make certain their mantel would not, once again, be defiled by The Monster.

Low 80's, bright sun, high humidity explains why most runners were slower than their predictions. Fastest time of the day goes to Dick Hessler, while Mark Hosler wins a CTC shirt for his good prediction, Joe Marks having won previously this year.

Remember in the July newsletter how we told that BEN LONDEREE had the 6th best time, nationally, for 45-49 year olds, for 10,000 meters and that he is 11th, all-time? Well, there is more to it than that. It has been announced that his 34:39 in the 1980 St. Louis Diet Pepsi race established a new US road race record for 10,000 meters for 46 year old men. That feat gets Ben a spot in the National Running Data Center record books as well as a handsome Brooks commemorative belt buckle. This award Ben will keep. (Ben has always recycled the trophies he wins). CONGRATULATIONS, BEN!!

BOB O'CONNELL lowered the record of 1:45:52 set last December by Jon Herbert. And he did it the hard way, besides having a warmer day to contend with. Bob started out with 18:06 for the first 5,000 and was already a couple of minutes behind record pace. Another 5k in 18:04 and Bob was now loosened up, so his next 5k's went 17:14, 17:40, 17:21 and Bob Goodrich was a convincing second with a PB of over 3 minutes. 16:421

STEVE HELMICK wasn't satisfied with 10,000, so he went on to 30,000, doing his second 10,000 only 3 seconds slower than the first 10,000, but then his third 10,000 was in 41:08--2:17 faster than the first, with a quick 20:16 over the last 5,000 meter leg up the hills. Remarkable running for a 12 year old with no previous experience over such a distance.

RACE CLOCK

We will have a race clock for the Clock Race and for the Heart of America Marathon, but it will be a stand-in for our own. Timing Products reports that Zetachron is having delays in getting the cabinets from their sheet metal shop, and so production is delayed. Instead of a 6-inch double-sided clock, they are sending us (at no charge to us) one of their 9-inch single-sided clocks to use in the 10K race and the marathon. We will send theirs back after the marathon and then wait about 2 weeks for our own 6-inch double-sided clock to arrive.

The delay works to our advantage in two ways. First, we will now get to play with both sizes: 6-inch and 9-inch. Second, we will get the newest version of the Zetachron, which has a simplified control box and is \$400 less expensive.

Since we are spending about \$2200 on the race clock, Timing Products will sell us hand-held timers at a 15% discount. In particular, we can get the new Heuer timers for about \$34, or about half the price in retail stores.


Retiring Taft seeks anecdotes from alumni

The history of journalism is not complete without the name of Dr. William Howard Taft.

The 65-year-old professor, who has taught History and Principles of Journalism since 1956, recently gave his final lecture for the required course, and his students gave him a standing ovation.

The sharp wit of his teaching style amused some and irritated others. Author of a syndicated Sunday School column, Taft used a deadpan delivery to poke fun at everything from red-headed girls to the Republic of China.

After teaching more than 10,000 students at the University, Taft feels modernization has taken some of the romance from journalism. "I'm old-fashioned," says the director of graduate studies for 12 years. "I like to see someone edit with a pencil—that's what makes it distinctively journalism. It's good to get printer's ink on your hands."

Taft plans to research and write, one of his first projects being a history of the School of Journalism. "What I'm interested in is alumni anecdotes," he says. "Any experience related to the School is what I want."

Perhaps a maneater editorial put it best: "The first third of the course is spent in absolute outrage that

William Howard Taft would foist his class off on college students... The second third is spent in frustration over ungodly amounts of trivia to be consumed and retained for exams... And the final third of the semester, most students have realized that the 65-year-old balding guy at the podium is pretty goddamn great. And what he teaches is well worth learning in the end... Thanks Willy."
