JON HERBERT WINS HEART OF AMERICA MARATHON WITH SECOND BEST TIME EVER RECORDED; 2:30:26; BOB O'CONNELL 2nd with 3rd best time ever, WENDY THOMAS sets new record for women, DICK HESSLER gets 2nd best age 40 & over time, WESLEY PAUL has new record for age 15 and under, but misses winning the Dave Schulte Award for Improved Performance—that goes to RICHARD MILLER of Springfield, Mo. All these things and a lot more happened on Labor Day, Sept. 7 in the 22nd running ot the H of A Marathon.

This year's race truly belonged to Jon Herbert. He had made 6 previous appearances and after the first one he always came back with the notion of winning. A couple of times he raced to early leads, but faded when confronted with heat and a hot sun. Last year he paced himself more sensibly, closed quite fast, but not fast enough to catch Steve Fisher. This year everything was just right. Jon is in perhaps the best condition he has ever been. Three weeks or so ago he got a PB for two miles: 9:31 and had, throughout the summer, competed as well as ever in races in and around Southwest Missouri. Labor Day, 1981, was the one day in a two week period with 100% cloud cover and even some drizzling rain, therefore, with temperatures in the upper 60's, humidity the upper 70's, 100% cloud cover, very moderate winds and the occasional light rain, the situation was just right for Jon and everyone else, not only for PB's, but for a run at some records.

After Herbert went by the 3 mile mark with a 12 second lead Rob Leutwiler took over and built a 150 yard or so margin which he nursed to Easley Hill. On Easley, Herbert pushed pretty hard, closed the gap and then simply drafted the St. Louisian until about 16 miles. After that Herbert took over and began thinking about the record of 2:29:15 set by Dennis Hinkamp in 1977. Herbert was ahead of Hinkamp's record

Dennis Hinkamp in 1977. Herbert was ahead of Hinkamp's record pace the entire race being as much as 90 seconds ahead at 15 miles. However, at 24 miles he was 5 seconds behind and didn't have the kick that Hinkamp had over the final 2-385. Leutwiler, by the way, ran H of A as an 18 year old in 1968 finishing 7th with 2:56:17. Not only that, he still holds the CTC 10 mile course (the old tough hilly course) record of 53:17 set in Feb., 1972.

BOB O'CONNELL had a magnificent performance posting the third best H of A time ever. (He and Herbert were under the age 30-39 record of 2:36:47 held by Gene McClain). Last year Bob got a good feel for the course with a 2:47:32. In our 30 kilo race in August Bob showed he was ready when he knocked off one of Jon Herbert's records. In the marathon Bob ranged along in 5th place through 15 miles, then began picking off the leaders. He got them all, save one--Jon Herbert.

WENDY THOMAS is the wife of the 18th place finisher, Steve Thomas, an Evansville, Ind. lawyer. Wendy had run only one previous marathon, a 3:12 effort in the New York Marathon last October. She certainly showed sub 3:00 potential as she lowered the women's record of 3:09:21 set by Joan Hirt in 1977. DEBBIE HOXWORTH ran with Wendy from about 7 miles to almost the 21 mile timing post, however, Wendy pulled away to her record while Debbie came on to a marathon PB only $2\frac{1}{2}$ minutes away from the record.

WESLEY PAUL was also a record-setter with his 3:02:19 beating the 3:04:09 set by Peter Ewers in 1977. Wesley has 3 more years to improve on that age 15 and under mark. No doubt Wesley was disappointed in not having a sub-3:00 for the first time in his last several marathons, but it is truly remarkable for a 12 year old to feel apologetic for a mere 3:02!

A discordant note in the race this year was the presence of a slow-moving freight train at the Easley crossing which held Miller, LaFontaine, Hessler, Goodrich, Fritz, Guinn, Rothlauf, Beach and Fox for anywhere from $4\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 minute. A frustrating wait for this group while the five leaders at that point were still moving forward. Miller still came on strong to place in the top five while the others probably didn't lose any places. In the future we will try to do something about that train. Once before, in 1976, a train came through at an inopportune time, but it only affected a group of runners who were going at a 4:00+ pace.

page 4 MORE ON THE HEART OF AMERICA MARATHON: DICK HESSLER had a scintillating performance in his debut as a 40 year old, posting the second best age 40+ time ever. His 2:44:09 has been bettered only by the 2:36:07 set by by Roger Rouiller in 1979. Sy Mah, age 55, Toledo, Ohio, made H of A his 221st marathon. Last year was #183, so Sy did 38 marathons in one year. Not only that, he had a "triple" over the Labor Day weekend. Sept. 5 he ran a marathon in Port Huron, Mich., Sept. 6 one in Buchanan, Mich. then an all day and most of the night car ride to Columbia for ours on Sept. 7. I haven't heard of anyone having done a "triple" before. In the Dave Schulte Award for Improved Performance, Richard Miller improved from the 3:35:49 he had in the 1970 heatbath as a 19 year old School of the Ozarks student to a 2:40:57. This was an improvement of 351 Gardner-Purdy points and 25.42%. Wesley Paul improved 310 points over the 4:04:08 he had as a seven year old in 1976. The percentage spread was much closer, however, as Wesley's percent improvement was 25.32% We had some 80 people who were involved in the support services for this race and to them we are indebted, for without their help we would not have much of a race. THANKS TO ALL OF YOU!! Also THANKS to Shelter Insurance Companies, the principal financial supporter of the race. Four runners predicted a time for the marathon and Tom LaFontaine achieved perfection when he predicted 2:43:00 and then ran 2:43:00 with an assist from the MKT railroad. Jim Pinkerton had a PB, so did Joe Marks by 10 seconds, and no doubt there were others. I think LaFontaine had a PB by one second. Steve Sargent, from Fulton wins a CTC shirt in his first competition as A CTC member—in fact, his first competition since his high school days. It didn't take him long to figure out how the DT format works.



THE NEW RECORD FOR D.T...

r..by Joe Marks eclipses the 0.28% deviation record established by the amazing Ben Londeree a couple years ago. To finish ahead of Ben this year, Joe missed his predicted times by 4 seconds or less in five races and by 10 seconds or less in nine races. His worst prediction was a 4-second miss in a 2-mile cross country run (0.56%). He missed a 30K by 31 seconds, but that was only a 0.42% deviation.

On the whole, there were some amazing numbers in this category with seven runners averaging less than 1% deviation. The closest battle was for the last DT trophy where LaFontaine hit his marathon on the nose. falling just short of Mike Koonse in overall average. (Mike missed by 79 sec., but that was close enough to toss out a worse miss than Tom could eliminate from his races.)

IN MEMORIAM

Larry O'Neil 1904-1981

Larry O'Neil died of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis on September 14, 1981 in Kalispell, Montana. Larry will forever be remembered as the first American in the "modern era" to walk 100 miles in less than 24 hours. In effect, he thereby became the founder of the Centurion Club of America and was fondly known as the Dean of the 100 mile walk. At age 60, on September 23 and 24, 1967, Iarry walked a lonely 100 miles in 19:24:34 on the Hickman High School track. This time was bettered only one time (by Larry Young, indoors, 1971, 18:07:12) until Alan Price posted his 18:57:01 in 1978. Larry's mark is still fourth best All-time out of some 65 Centurion performances. The 100 mile walk has been held 14 times on Hickman track and, until last year, Larry had missed only one of the walks, that in 1972 when he was in Europe touring with a Masters team. Six times Larry walked 100 miles in less than 24 hours. In every future 100 mile walk conducted on Hickman track, all who knew Larry will always feel his presence. He will be missed.
