There were 20 other runners and 2 walkers Rob Spier at 1:47:13 and Bill Taft at 2:01:02. Also, this was Tom Hinckley's last race in Columbia—he jogged along in 1:09:10, some 17 minutes faster than his DT, so he got the kraut and later got some hot dogs to go with it as a going away present.

- AND. . . A Look at Today's Heroes and Heroines:
- St. Louis Marathon, Nov. 18: TERRY RACKERS made his marathon debut with a fine 3:17:15, finishing in 201st place. The Helias track coach, Russell Martin came in at 2:34:57, while Allen Hentges had 3:37. JASON SHEAR was there but we have no time for him.
- JOE DUNCAN ran the Honolulu Marathon on Dec. 9, finishing in the top
 40% with a leisurely 3:56:55. Conditions were quite similar
 to what we had for Heart of America...70's, cloud cover for
 the first two hours, humid, but, in addition, in Honolulu we
 had strong headwinds (gusting up to 30MPH) for the first 15
 miles. 8300 finishers, superb organization. REAGAN & RHONDA
 THOMAS ran this race, also, coming across at 4:20 or so.
- JON HERBERT finished 2nd behind Randy Starr in the Springfield Bicycle Club Biathlon (a 10k run & a 15.7 mike bike) with a time of 1:21:32 (34:00 for the run). This was Nov. 18. Prior to that Jon was 16th in the Tulsa 15k run (Oct. 27) at 52:10 then on Nov. 3 he won a 50 mile run in Tulsa in 6 hours, 44 minutes. Jon has entered three 50 mile events and has won two of them.
- MARILYN HOLSINGER was 3rd, 60-70, in the Macy's 10,000 meter run on Nov. 4 at 57:34.
- BOB DOLPHIN ran another marathon. Nov. 25, the Seattle Marathon in a park and shore setting along Lake Washington. Bob says this was an "easy" marathon for him despite a chest cold and only 18 miles per week in the four weeks since New York (with a few 5-milers being his "long" runs). Bob was at 7:00 pace for the first half, then slowed quite a bit but still finished 3:20:50 for his 4th best marathon (out of 23). There were some 833 finishers in that race, low 40's, overcast, brief drizzle, basically flat, 4 minor hills. A week prior to that Bob was 22:40 for a 3.3 mile race (3rd of 15) and a week prior to that he was 6:35 for a 1.1 mile Turkey Trot. Both of these were in Yakima.
 - Obviously there have been many other out-of-town events which have seen CTC participation, but nothing will be said of them or future events unless the information is given to Joe Duncan, preferably already written down. CRIATHLETE

Por the first time, Liz Bulman experienced doubt about competing in a triathlon. Weather conditions always are a factor in outdoor sports, but this was serious. The water would be cold — about 60 degrees. There was no avoiding that. When the gun sounded, Bulman jumped, struggling to swim the competition's opening event. As her feet went numb, she fought to maintain a steady pace. Then the chill spread to her hands. Her legs were losing sensation. And the race had only begun.

Bulman's training program tends to get top priority in her life. She runs almost every day, bikes four or five times a week and swims the same at the University Natatorium. That type of dedication often means missing a movie or a pizza with friends. But missing a movie or a pizza with friends. But Bulman should know how to organize her training schedule. She studies exercise physi-

ology at the University.

Bulman, from Stow, Ohio, is a 25-year-old graduate student who needs complete only two more courses and a dissertation to earn her Ph.D. degree. She swam competitively in high school and at Bowling Green State Uni-versity and entered shorter races before trying the marathon in 1981. She set the wornen's course record of 3 hours, 7 seconds at the 1982 Heart of America marathon in Columbia and won the Macy's Marathon Nov. 4 in Kansas City with a personal best of 2:48:02.

Triathlons are now her focus, however. She did her first triathlon in August 1983 and tried her first Tinman in September 1983 in Kansas City. "If I had been in that water five more minutes, I thought they would have to pull me out," Bulman says that of competition.

The Kansas City Tinman was half the Ironman, Hawaii's annual endurance rite consisting of a 2 4-mile Wairiki rough-water swim

ing of a 2.4-mile Waikiki rough-water swim, 112-mile Oahu bike race and the Honolulu marathon, a 26.2-mile run.

Although triathlons were held in San Diego as early as 1974, the Ironman derived from an argument among Navy drinking buddies in 1977. It seems there was a question as to

which athlete — runner, biker or swimmer — was physically most fit. After bets were placed (beer being the prize) the 15 contestants combined the three rugged events to form triathlon's showcase, the Ironman.

Bulman trains for her eventual goal - that Super Bowl of triathlons — by competing in others, mostly in the Midwest. This July in Chicago, Bud Lite sponsored the largest triathlon yet held in North America, with 1,-800 participants swimming one mile, biking 25 and running 6.2. Bulman finished fifth in the women's division, just behind some of the biggest names in triathlon today: Sylviane and Patricia Puntous, Colleen Cannon and Julia Moss. Julie Moss.

Her effort triggered the next step toward the Ironman. After the race, she received an offer to compete in a triathlon held Aug. 25 in New York City. There, Bulman out-maneuvered two of the favorites. Racing through Central Park, she neared the finish of the third and final segment and caught Moss on the run.

"I asked her if we were close to Colleen Cannon," Bulman says. "She told me Cannon was only 100 yards ahead. That spurred me on; then I caught Cannon. She wondered where Julie Moss was. I said, 'Oh, I think you'll beat her.'"

Hinshaw had better times.

Bulman crawled out of the chilling water and staggered toward her bike. First it was necessary to change clothes. Dressing took five minutes as she fumbled with her gear, fighting the hypothermia that confused both mind and body. Then onto the bike as Bulman strove to restore feeling to her limbs. For two miles her feet were lead. Dazed, she worried about the gears; had she set them correctly? Keep up the pace, don't let anyone pass and hope that the chain stays on and the tires hold out . . .

Bulman says she felt physiological changes in her body as she trained, which led logically to further study. Thus, her training prin-

ciples are based not only on trial and error, but on reading and research.

"I think I have a big edge in that I can apply my knowledge toward my training program," Bulman says. "A lot of people think I'm crazy for the way I train. But I understand my limits and avoid injuries."

Bulman works as a research assistant at the Human Performance Laboratory in Rothwell Gymnasium. Part of the Department of Health and Physical Education, the lab conducts three major tests — it measures stress level, excess body fat and strength and flexibility. The lab also recommends nutrition

programs and diagnoses and offers advice to runners with knee problems.

"What I want to do is get people to realize that they do need to exercise, and that a planned program is very important," Bulman and the state of the sta

man says.

man says.

She says triathlons are not dangerous to the body — if you're in shape — because of the need to pace yourself throughout the three-part race. The swimming and biking portions don't wear you out; it's the marathon that presents a danger.

"The run can tear down your body," Bulman says. "But by the time you get that far, you can't run as fast. It's less hard on the bodythan aroad race."

The sport of triathlon is mushrooming. The first Ironman attracted 14 men and one woman. The prize at the initial Ironman: trophies

an. The prize at the initial Ironman: trophies made of nuts and bolts. The first prize in an upcoming race sponsored by the Association of Professional Triathletes: \$50,000.

Triathlon is international. This year's Ironman featured entrants from 32 countries.

Corporations are getting involved by sponsoring triathlete teams. AT&T thinks it will be the sport of the '90s, if not the '80s. Bulman guesses the triathlon will reach the Olympics

Triathlon may be the fastest-growing sport in America. One estimate in Sports Illustrated put the figure for the first nine months at more than 200,000 Americans competing in more than 1,000 triathlons throughout the country. Two glossy publications Triathless country. Two glossy publications, Triathlon Magazine and Tri-Athlete, are only the most visible chroniclers of the sport. Its growth is predictable if you consider a chart appearing

in a recent Triathlon Magazine that lists swimming, running/jogging and biking as three of the four most popular participatory sports in the nation. (The other is calisthenics.)

The Ironman still offers no cash winnings; its original concept seemingly defines participation as prize enough. But top contenders perform before the eager eyes of companies hungry for athletes to endorse their wares.

Bulman has her sights set on the October 1985 Ironman.
"When I do it, I want to finish in the top

10," Bulman says.

The triathlon has become Bulman's prime motivator in recent months. She has won \$6,-000 already this year, and although entrants don't yet receive guaranteed sums to appear in triathlons, Bulman thinks that is only a couple of years away. She hopes to have a sponsor by next spring to pay traveling expenses, clothing and equipment costs. Currently she helps conduct a triathlon clinic for a sporting goods store in Kansas City and plans to run in the 1985 Boston Marathon. Now that Bulman is entering the top ranks, she has added incentive to excel. She may have to relocate to Southern California, where many triathletes train year round. But

merely competing brings rewards.

"If you can do this, you get the feeling you can do anything that comes to you in life,"

Bulman says.

Bulman ditched the bike and steeled her-self for the most demanding leg of the triathlon. She knew that no one must catch her in the road race: 13.1 miles of pounding the ground, foot after foot. Bulman's mind locked into forward motion. Her legs went into action as she thought not about the passing time but about passing anyone ahead of her. And of how good it would feel to finish.

Outfitting the Triathlete

Sometimes I think triathlons were an invention of sporting goods manufacturers. They have the potential to be the most expensive self-propelled sport ever devised.

Even so, participation has soared. About 250,000 people participated in triathlons in 1983, and the number is expected to balloon to 600,000 this year. If you follow sports trends, this is about the number of people who were running marathons before 1972. It was in 1972 that the running boom was ignited by Frank Shorter winning the Olympic marathon on national television. In 1981, the triathlon's fuse was lit by the national TV coverage of the Hawaii Ironman Triathlon.

Who is running all these triathlons? About 80% of all triathletes are men. The average age for male participants is 32, while the average woman participant is 25. But here's the kicker: The average triathlete's annual income is \$35,000.

Fortunately, the frugal triathlete need not be at a competitive disadvantage. It is still thengine and not the equipment that wins most races. It is just that the triathlon offers unlimited potential to spend.

Most of us own or have access to the equipment needed to become at least a recreational triathlete. Without going into too much detail, here's a list of equipment and costs:

Training shoes (\$40-\$90); nylon shorts (\$5-15); sweat suit (\$10-\$20); watch (\$10-\$50), racing shoes (\$40-\$80); swimsuit (\$5-\$50); swim cap (\$2-\$10); goggles (\$3-\$30); books and coaching (\$0-\$100); training aids, like kickboards, leg floats, etc. (\$0-\$20); bike (\$250-\$500-plus); helmet (\$20-\$60); repair kit (\$10-\$20); water bottle (\$3-7); shoes and pants (\$40-\$100); gloves (\$8-\$16).

Obviously, you don't need all this equipment, and you can rent (or borrow) rather than buy. It depends on what kind of a triathlete/person you are.

There are two basic schools of thought in triathlon racing. I call them the Holistic Triathlete and the Schizophrenic Triathlete.

The holistic triathlete attacks lthe race as a uniquely individual sport. The schizophrenic triathlete sees it as three different sports that just happen to be done one after the other on the same day.

Many new products are geared to the holistic triathlete. For instance, there are triathlon skin suits, triathlon running shoes, triathlon bike shoes and triathlon bikes. Most of them are sold on the basis of saving time in transition from event to event. The shoes have Velcro fastseners instead of laces, and the triathlon skin suits are designed to be worn in the water, on the bike and during the run.

Unless you are competing with the best triathletes in the world, it is doubtful that a few seconds some of these products wave will be worth the money.

The skin suits are designed to be used in all three events, which means that they are not perfect for any one of the events. I find that the few seconds it takes to change from swim suit to bike shorts to running shorts is worth the psychological edge it gives. It makes me feel that I am changing from a swimmer to a biker to a runner. Wearing the same outfit the entire race only serves to remind me that the triathlon is one long race, rather than a series of relatively short ones.
