# Madsen Misses By Two Seconds in Cheese & 'Kraut 10- Miler

Dick Madsen predicted that he would run 10 miles in 1:06:55 before the Cheese and Sauerkraut 10 Mile road race on December 10. ( was off by two seconds, finishing in 1:06:53 without the aid of a watch. Dick perenially wins the cheese for coming closest to his predicted time in this event. His trick is simple: he predicts a time that he knows will be difficult for him and then runs accordingly. It still seems like magic to the rest of us. Joe Marks came in second to Madsen in meeting his predicted time, missing by 48 seconds, and Doug Sonheim was third, with a 56 second error. Dan Lawson and Steve Stonecipher-Fisher finished the course st, but missed their predicted time by 2.54 and 2:55, respectively. Linda Price led the women in matching her predicted time, missing by 1:17. Patti Ross finished the course first for the women, but missed her time by 2:46. Georgina Gonzalez finished the race third, missing her time by 2:10. Georgina was one of only three who ran slower than their designated time. The other 15 runners found the course to be faster than they expected.

## CONGRATULATIONS, GEORGINA! by Linda Price

There is at least one other time and placing to report on a finisher in the St. Louis Marathon held November 20, 1988. Georgina Gonzalez - 5:08:30. This was Georgina's first marathon and she deserves recognition for that accomplishment. True, as runners, we are in awe of marathoners who streak to the finish in 2, 3 and, yes, even 4 hours....and they deserve credit. But we've got to admire runners like Georgina, too, who, enduring numerous obstacles during training, and miserable weather conditions on race day, stick with it to the end. Those of us "at the back of the pack" may not possess the physical talent of younger, faster runners, but surely the same amount of dedication is there — perhaps a little more so? It never entered her mind to quit that day, althoug it would have been understandable if she had.

She had been preparing for this event for a long time. Three and a half years ago, when I first met Georgian, we talked about distances we had run and our running goals for the future. She shared with me that she wanted to run a marathon when she turned 50. The three years passed quickly.

Georgina decided to run St. Louis for her first marathon. I gave her a dog-eared copy of "How to Run Your First Marathon," and she was off, following the schedule religiously. While I had the luxury of running in the morning before work, Georgina had to put in most of her training miles after work and in the dark. We ran together whenever our schedules allowed, but that wasn't often.

Medical problems intervened. Still, she continued with her training. I was impressed. Two weeks before St. Louis, she bruised her left great toe, and the nail had to be removed. A visit to Steve S-F to consult on the shoe ..."do we cut a hole in the top of the new shoe? Yes!" She continued training. The week of the race, she received a worn-out sock from her 7-month old grandson with anote from her daughter-in-law, with this note: "Here's hoping some of Spenser's energy will be with you in St. Louis." On November 20th, the baby sock was pinned to her running tights and the toe was bandaged.

She was nervous at the start. Could she do it? She had run 18 in training and could not imagine running 8 more on top of that. She was concerned about the 1:00 pm course closing. Earlier, she had written to the St. Louis Track Club about traffic control after 1pm. She thought she could finish in 5 hours, but wasn't positive.

She feels confident now that if road conditions had been better, she would have finished in under 5 hours. Due to weather conditions and my own physical condition, I was not at the finish line for her, and I regret that. Even the professional photographer had packed it in. Nevertheless, she completed in 5:08:30, and placed third in her age group.

Once again, CONGRATULATIONS, GEORGINA....from ALL of us!
