# Curotto Returns for Another Heart and Takes it Home <u>Without a Challenge</u>

Frank Curotto won his third Heart of America Marathon on October 18, his second straight win and third in four years (he did not run it in 1985). For the first time since 1984, the race was run on the official course, unimpeded by the floods that intervened in '85 and '86. Although Curotto has not run the course as many times as Lou Fritz, he is becoming a legend of his own, having now run in 10 Hearts since his first in 1976. Lou made his 23rd appearance, finishing 5th overall in 2:55:32. Lou was in pursuit of another Heart veteran, Bill Fox at the end, but Bill held on to lead Lou by 38 seconds (time: 2:54:54). Richard Montano was the first Columbian to finish, placing third in 2:53:43 in his first Heart. Congratulations!

Lisa Harrison, a senior art major at Mizzou ran the race on a lark and won the women's division in 3:32:42. According to the local newspaper accounts, Lisa avoided telling her parents and boyfriend that she was running the marathon, knowing they would disapprove. Well, Lisa, you can't expect to hide your racing from the public eye if you win events like the Heart! Maybe it's time to come out of the closet, face up to your running habit and be proud of it!

Roger Turnbough won the Dave Schulte Award for improved performance, running a 3:06:44 this year. His 1986 time was 3:52:19, so his improvement amounted to 19.6 % in one year. Congratulations, Roger!

The field was smaller than last year's by one finisher. As race director and president-for-life Joe Duncan said, we will continue to hold the race as long as Lou Fritz shows up for it. But it would be preferable to share the experience with a few more of the unique runners who are attracted to this event. Perhaps a broader appeal throughout the Midwest will attract more in the coming years. We plan to try several tactics to broaden the field of potential runners for 1988. But the tradition and distinctiveness of the Heart are strong reasons to carry on during this lean period, confident that our fields will grow back to the 100-finisher fields we have had in the past.

Many volunteers should be recognized for helping with this year's marathon. Joe Duncan directed the race again, assisted by Kim Stonecipher-Fischer (Aid Station Director), members of the Hickman cross-country team, Eric Mumford, Joyce Schulte, Ben Londeree, Joe Marks, Jean Madden and many more. Shelter Insurance was the major financial sponsor again this year. Others providing assistance included Joe Machens Ford (use of two pickups), Gerbes (reduced price on Gatorade) and Nowell's (\$50 worth of fruit).

Don Lewis once again produced a successful and exciting 8K with enough names to keep anyone confused (is it the Channel 8K, the Run Around Old Mizzou, or the Run Around Old Channel 8?). Weather conditions had warmed some from those for the start of the Heart of America Marathon, providing a brisk and invigorating setting. Highlights included wins by Steve Stonecipher-Fischer in 25:31 and Milene Mittelhauser in 30:05. Tom LaFontaine set a new club record for the 40-49 age group, with a 27:16 (formerly held by Don Lewis at 27:17) and Lewis broke his old record for the 50-59 age group, in 28:14 (formerly 29:06). Boots Gerhardt smashed the club record for women age 60 & over with a 45:35 (formerly 46:45 by Marilyn Holsinger, set in 1985). Boots now owns six of the nine club records in this age group!

# CTC Represented at Regional Fall Events

Columbia Track Club runners made strong showings at a number of events around the Midwest during the fall race season. The Mexico 4-mile Soybean Run (ever seen a 4-mile soybean?) drew 105 runners on September 20. Marc Romine led the pack in 20:59, followed by Dennis Stewart in 21:50. Lynn Russell set a new course record for women, finishing seventh overall, first for women in 23:31. A large contingent of other CTC runners participated as well.

Steve Stonecipher-Fischer placed fifth in a windy Half-Marathon Chicago on October 25 in 1:10:04. Steve Jones (not a CTC member) led the way in 1:04:20.

Milene Mittelhauser placed 10th in the Prime Health Kansas City 10K on Oct. 25 in 39:01 (the old Macy's course). Tom LaFontaine placed 2nd (34:14) in the Masters Division and Don Lewis placed 5th (36:04).

Kent Lang led the CTC charge at the 16th Annual St. Louis Marathon on November 22, placing fourth overall, with a time of 2:30:??. Others from Columbia included Bob O'Connell (50th, 2:48:28), Norm Stebbins (2:49:00), Kevin O'Bannon (2:52:49), Mark Hosler (2:54:40), Tom Coon (2:58:25), Dick Madsen (3:03:18), Randy Smith (3:09:28), Elmer Schlemper (3:09:37), Don Johnson (3:31) and probably others that I missed.

### THE DOLPHIN REPORT

One thing that you realize when you begin putting this newsletter together is that Dr. Bob Dolphin is one unusual person. It was my misfortune to come to Columbia after Bob left for Seattle, so I only know him from his considerable offerings sent to us through the mail. Perhaps it is an understatement, but the easiest way to give the Dolphin report is to say that he runs a lot of races. Here is the full story, though:

#### COLUMBIA TRACK CLUB

MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING October 8, 1987

The meeting was held in the community room of the Farm & Home Savings Association and was attended by 32 members.

The meeting was opened at 7:10 p.m. by Joe Duncan.

Minutes of the last annual meeting were summarized by Tom Coon, who has the minutes of the last two meetings in his possession.

Report of the treasury was given by Dick Madsen. A copy of the report was given to Joe Duncan.

The following items were reported by Joe Duncan:

Columbia Parks & Recreation Department has previously helped CTC financially with \$2500 for newsletter, etc. Last year \$1000 was allocated; therefore, the size and frequency of publication of the newsletter were reduced in accordance with this adjusted amount. Last year there was no cash balance remaining from publication of the newsletter for CTC to spend as desired. During the coming year Parks & Recreation can contribute nothing to the publication of the newsletter, effective Oct. 1, the beginning of their fiscal year. The city will print the newsletter for 4d/copy/page. Bulk rate nonprofit postage costs 8 1/2d per newsletter. Last month we mailed 275 newsletters.

Dues cost \$10/family; \$6/single student; \$5/first time member; \$25/sustaining membership. A motion to keep dues at the same rate, including the feature of sustaining membership, was seconded and carried.

Scholarship fund report was given by Ben Londeree as follows:

Current balance Sept. 2 about \$5600 in an account earning about 9.5% interest. At that rate we could probably fund a \$500 scholarship annually. It was decided that the award of a scholarship is to be decided by the scholarship committee. We will publicize the application for scholarship in the next newsletter and on the University campus this fall. The idea of a scholarship fund was generated by Joyce Schulte several years ago and she serves on the committee.

\$330 was spent for travel this year primarily by children for Jr. Olympics and Mark Volek for the Ironman Triathlon.

Schedule of events for 1988 was discussed. The schedule has remained virtually the same for the past 10 years in terms of the number, type, and frequency of events. It was noted that in

last year's races there was a <u>dramatic</u> reduction in the numbers of partipants. The low participation vs. the time spent in organizing races for informal events was discussed.

It was announced that the Turkey Trot this year will occur one week after Heart of America Marathon. Turkey Trot will be held on October 25 in Columbia. Don Lewis asked for a show of hands to indicate an estimate of the number of participants for the Turkey Trot, and he encouraged us to think seriously about our participation. The idea of expanding this race to include Jeff City and Sedalia was discussed. The idea of changing the date of this race to coincide with the end of high school cross country season or to coincide with the St. Louis cross country kick-off in late August was discussed. If was decided that we would provide chili from Wendy's for the Turkey Trot, with baked items to be contributed by all members. This "lunch" is to be coordinated by Anne Hessler and Judy Mumford.

Don Lewis also suggested that we should coordinate the scheduling of various races within the city of Columbia so that we don't have major races occurring each weekend or in conflict with one another.

There was discussion regarding charging a fee for the Human Race. It was recommended that we charge a fee and give shirts. It is observed that a lack of fee has not increased participation.

It was suggested by Don Lewis that CTC devise a contract to be used when dealing with sponsors for races in order to help us obtain the desired support as promised.

Kim Stonecipher-Fisher reported that aid stations for the marathon will be at 5, 10, 15, 20, and 24 miles and will be provided by various businesses; anyone is welcome to help.

Tom Coon encouraged members to think about some new races, different races; i.e. a series of cross country races following the Turkey Trot, new events as well as changing emphases on some of our established races. Tom is encouraging creativity in the kinds of races we offer. The newly established Program Committee can work on this, but all members are encouraged to contribute their ideas. All members should participate in administrating one or two events annually. The Program Committee was advised by the members present to avoid scheduling events more frequently than two per month.

It was agreed that our youth programs (summer age group events, CTC Colts, Jr. Olympics) should continue if people are willing to help prepare. Co-directors are needed to carry on events in the following years. This year there has been increased participation in summer age group events.

With regard to race administration race directors were encouraged to be creative with awards, etc. Volunteer assistance is always needed for all races.

Election of officers was held. All officers were accepted as proposed by the Nominating Committee composed this year of Chris Ruble, Steve Stonecipher-Fisher and Joe Marks.

Some of the details remain to be settled, but the first four months are firm. In developing this schedule, we wanted to avoid conflicts with major events in nearby cities. We worked particularly with the Sedalia and Jefferson City Clubs, both of which provide a number of challenging events. To meet this goal, we have reduced the number of CTC-sponsored events in Columbia, which should help us to concentrate our corps of volunteers and sponsors (in other words, avoid overworking them). At the same time, we hope to make our events more enjoyable and to enlist more sponsors to help us promote our events. The success of the Columbia Regional Hospital Run For Your Life has shown us how important it is to promote our events. Columbians want to run!
