## Steve Stonecipher-Fisher Brings Heart of America Crown Back to Columbia

Perfect weather conditions and perhaps a bit of a whim combined to bring the Heart of America Marathon titl ack to the CTC. Steve Stonecipher-Fisher won this race in 1980 (2:35:32) and after 8, years decided it was time for another go at it. He did not make his plans public until a few days before the race. With a modest 50 to 60 miles/week training regimen, Steve wanted a relaxed long workout prior to the St. Louis Marathon and he did run easily over the entire distance. He was pressed by Steve Cline, Burlington, lowa and Frank Curotto, St. Louis, MO for only the first mile.

Steve Cline now has his third second-place finish to go with three third-place finishes and one fifth. Cline and Curotto ran together for 24 miles, but just after the lile checkpoint, Cline moved away. Curotto finished third, having won the race the last three times he was here (1984, 1986 & 1987).

Chris Ruble was the first female finisher after finishing second 3 other times and not having run this race since 1984.

Lou Fritz ran his 24th consecutive HOA, all but two of them being under 3 hours (once in the heat of 1970 and the other in 1978, when he was here with an injured thigh), and those were 3:01's. Lou and Bill Fox hooked up in another of their traditional duels and for the first time (after 5 tries), Lou got the edge over Bill in the 40-49 category. However, in 13 matchups, Lou leads Bill by 7 to 6.

Bob Dolphin won the Dave Schulte Award for Improved Performance, his 3:09:31 showing an 18.45% improvement over the 3:52:24 he had in 1983. This he does at age 59! In fact, two weeks prior to the HOA, Bob ran the Portland Marathon in 3:06 and then a week later came the Twin Cities in 3:06. Bob moved to Yakima, Washington 5 years ago and during that time we have been receiving all these accounts of spectacular performances by Bob completely unlike his record when here in Columbia. Now with this performance in the HOA, the legend has been confirmed. He is for real!!

Don Johnson set a new standard for age 60 & over, his 3:37.28 shattering Howard Calkin's 4:23:13 from 1982.

As usual, many, many people need to be recognized for their work in making this event a success. with Mike getting the edge as they made the tight turn to the finish line. Mike's time was 23:38, just two seconds ahead of Charlie in 23:40. This translates to about a 29:32 10-K time or a 4:45 per mile pace and is about a minute and ten seconds or so off the world record for the 8-K distance. Mike took home \$400 for his efforts while Charlie garnered \$375 for second place and for being first at the three mile mark.

In the women's race, Michelle McFadden win second at three miles after Liz Bulman surged between miles two and three to take home the \$75 premium awarded to the leader at the three mile mark. However, Michelle finished quite strong and won the overall women's award of \$400. Michelle looked in control as she crossed the finish line 38 seconds ahead of Liz.

The competition in the Men's Masters race was quite good with the first six Masters men finishing under 30 minutes. Mark Hosler was first in 28:29, with Norm Stebbins coming in a close second in 28:42. There was only a 1:12 differential between 1st and 6th in the Men's Masters competition. In the Women's Masters race, Susan Wilson was first in 32:41. Susan accordingly was the fifth woman overall and had a 34 second cushion between her and the second place finisher, Sandy Dunafon.

In all, 268 entered and 246 finished this event. In addition to the overall and Masters cash awards, there were about 69 other awards presented, including certificates from Tryathletics for shoes for first place, watches for second place and running shorts for third place in all age divisions. The other awards included several special categories such as the first finisher who wore a Shakespeare's t-shirt. Among the age group and special category winners was Joe Duncan who finished third in the 50-59 year-old age group and won the category for being the oldest male finisher

employed by Shelter Insurance Company who ran the course under 40 minutes. Don Johnson finished the course in 33:21 and captured the crown for being the oldest finisher under 35 minutes. There are many more finishers who could be recognized, and they are listed following page 6. Everyone had a good time and enjoyed the event, along with the food and "Old Time" fiddle music provided by Columbia's Taylor McBaine, accompanied on guitar and harmonica by Gary Sparks, Walter Calvin and Ed Roddy.

The Fourteenth running of the Turkey Trot Three Mile Cross-country Race will be staged at Shaw Park in St. Louis on Sunday, October 30. Race time is set for 1:00 pm. This is a team event, including the traditional rivals, the hosting St. Louis Track Club and the Columbia Track Club. For the third consecutive year, the Jefferson City Striders will join in the team competition, as well. The St. Louis Club has dominated the team competition in recent years, however the CTC pulled out victories in the Men's Masters and Women's Divisions last year. The SLTC can be expected to put up a strong showing to take back the travelling trophy. WE NEED TO HAVE AS MANY RUNNERS COMPETING AS WE CAN!

A team bus will be leaving from the Hickman High parking lot (northwest side of building) at 9:00 am. CTC members are encouraged to ride on the bus. Bus fare will be \$4.00 per rider. The 18 mile split as shown above is the adjusted reading and probaccurate within 10 seconds or so. The times called out during the race were called some 250 yards short of the 18 mile point.

# One Runner's Perspective on the AAU Jr. Olympics National Track & Field Meet Angela Hessler

The personal experience I gained from the National Junior Olympic meet was one of great value. Although I did not come home with a medal or a personal best time, I received an image of organization and great support from my participation in this meet. I found Nationals to be one of the most successful and fantastic activities ever planned for youths in the United States.

The most important aspect of this competition was its high number of outstanding performances. It was full of athletes with great expectations and supporters with many words of encouragement. Most of all, this meet was a symbol of our country's strength and security.

Compared to the National meet I attended and ran in two years ago, the basic quality of the AAU National Championships has improved a great deal. In 1986, the announcing was not as good as you might expect, and the races were held up to almost two hours late. This year, I could hardly find one fault with the meet when I was there.

I hope that many more CTC Colts members work their way to the AAU National meet. We have a sturdy program with many excellent athletes. Many of them are capable of performing to their limits to gain the same valuable experience as I did through the National Championships.
