Mittelstadt, Bulman Run Away in 3-2-1

Scott Mittelstadt and Liz Bulman led the pack in the 3-2-1 triathlon at Hickman Track on Saturday, May 13. Weather conditions were favorable for good performances, with temperatures in the low 60's and a clear sky. Each runner ran a 3 mile, then a 2 mile and then a 1 mile race on the track, with a short rest period between each. Scott had the fastest times in all three events, with a 16:17 3 mile, 10:34 2 mile and 5:08 1 mile. Liz led the women competitors (where were the other women?) with a 19:09, 12:38 and 6:06. Dick and Carole Madsen served as race directors, with Joe Marks assisting. Dick reports:

"Thanks to Joe Marks for coming out to help with the race. Mark Volek's new shoes gave him a blister after the 3 mile, but he stayed around to help with timing which we appreciated. As you can see from the times, there were some close races which were fun for the spectators in attendance. In keeping with the 3-2-1 theme, awards were given to the finishers who finished fastest and equal awards were given to those who spent the most time on the track. Three doughnuts were awarded to the top 3 in the fastest and slowest categories, two doughnuts went to the next three in each category, and had more participants been present, one doughnut would have been given to the next three. Dean Baxter should have received an extra award for finishing as both the sixth fastest and the sixth slowest. Since Scott Mittelstadt won the whole thing, he received an extra award of a dozen doughnut holes."

Thanks, Dick and Carole! Undoubtedly, Dick's statistical acumen went into figuring how many doughnuts are required to a) slow the fastest runners and b) keep the slowest runners from catching up.

Denny Stewart, CTC member from Warrensburg swept the sprint triathlon once again, and he did it with relative ease. As the times show, he paced Bob Hull and Steve Engelbrecht through the first three laps of the 1500 and the first lap of the 800, but then broke away during the final lap of each race. He jumped to an early lead in the 400 m and never let up. Josie Cox led the women competitors, finishing second to Andrea Woods in the 1500, but surpassing Woods in the 800 and 400 for a faster cumulative time. Josie used the event as a workout in preparing for the Jr. Olympics State Meet on June 17.

Stewart entered the realm of the Masters this year, and has been burning up the track in his second youth. He won the Masters 800 m races at both the Kansas Relays (2:00.5) and the Drake Relays (1:59.7) in April. Look for more speedy performances by Denny in the coming months!

AREA 4 JUNIOR OLYMPICS TRACK & FIELD MEET BRINGS OUT THE BEST

Over 90 young athletes ranging in age from 5 to 14 competed in this 7-county event at Rock Bridge High School on Saturday, June 3. This is the first level in a series of meets which lead to the National AAU/Carrier Junior Olympics Games to be held in San Antonio, Texas, later this summer. The top three finishers in each event advanced to the Western Missouri meet in Joplin on June 17-18. At the Columbia meet, the athletes competed in six divisions based on age and sex. Older athletes, ages 15 - 18 advanced to the Western Missouri meet automatically. The Columbia Track Club and Columbia Parks and Recreation Department sponsored this annual event and wish to thank all of the many volunteers who helped make the meet possible.

The athletes were slowed somewhat by the muddy conditions of the track following Saturday morning's early showers. Even so, some outstanding individual and team efforts resulted in three records broken, one tied and two new records set. Chris Braudis, Columbia, took over 45 seconds off the Junior Division (ages 13&14) 3000 m race walk. Chris placed second at the National Junior Olympics meet last year in Lawrence, Kansas. Stephen Shepherd, Jefferson City, lowered his previous record in the Bantam Division (ages 10 and under) 200 m dash, from 30.3 to 30.2. Jennifer Hasler, also of Jefferson City took 2 seconds off the Junior Girls 100 m Low Hurdles record, from 19.0 to 17.0. Hasler and Chuck Glasper, Jefferson City

set new records in the 200 m low hurdles, a new event for the Girls and Boys Junior Divisions this year. Jennifer finished in 32.0, neck and neck with Chuck, at 31.9. The Junior Girls 4 x 100 m relay team of Dawn Anthony, Dawn Larry, Julia Simmons and Angie Johnson tied the old record of 53.9, set by another Jefferson City team in 1985.

Two other National Junior Olympians from 1988 turned in performances that show they should have another good year in the program. Robyn Colvin, Columbia placed 10th in the Bantam Girls 400 m dash last year in a time of 1:13.5. This year, she advanced to the Midget Division (ages 11-12) and ran 1:11.4 at the muddy Area 4 meet. Brandon Beissenherz, Columbia, placed 10th in the Midget Boys 400 m dash at the National meet last year with a time of 1:04.5. He got off to a good start this year, winning the Midget 400 m dash in 1:04.6.

Many other young athletes showed improvement in their performances and deserve recognition. The full listing of results begins on the following page. Congratulations to all participants!

The Intermediate Girls 3200 m relay team placed first, the Midget boys 1600 m relay team placed second and the Midget and Junior girls 1600 m relay teams placed third. Among individual performances, Brandon Beissenherz placed first in the Midget boys 400 m dash, Kevin Lewis placed second in the Bantam 400, 800 and long jump, Shannon McDonald placed second in the Junior 3000 m, Jeff Borengasser placed second in the Midget 3000m, Shawn McDonald placed second in the Intermediate 1500m and the javelin, Chris Cronhardt placed third in the Intermediate 800 m, Karla Pudenz placed fourth in the Junior 800 m and Angela Hessler placed fourth in the Intermediate 400 m.
