Body Composition Analysis

I am looking for active adults who are 50 years old or older who would be interested in having their body composition measured. I am trying to gather some data about body composition and activity levels in older adults in order to begin to understand how aging and activity affect body composition and to develop some standards for body composition in this age group.
