#### Starting young

The Columbia Parks and Recreation Department is putting on a Kids' Triathlon beginning at 9 a.m., Saturday, July 17, at the Twin Lakes Recreation Area on Chapel Hill Road.

There are three age groups, for 7-9-year-olds, 10-12-year-olds and 13-14-year-olds. The youngest group competes in a 25-yard swim, 1.5-mile bike and half-mile run. The older two groups compete in a 50-yard swim, 3.1-mile bike and 1.5-mile run.

Competition is limited to 60 entries. Entry fees are \$5 for individuals and \$7 for teams.

#### Upcoming events


