Heart of America

Now is the time to come to the aid of Joe Duncan.

Joe needs volunteers to help with the 34th annual Heart of America Marathon, which will be run in its traditional Labor Day time slot. That's Monday, Sept. 6 if you don't have a calendar handy.

The race will begin at 6 a.m. and the course will tour the hills south of Columbia, with a downtown finish. Aid stations will be situated about every two miles.

Awards will go to the first six male finishers and first three female finishers, as well as to the first three male finishers 40-49, the first two male finishers over 50 and the first female finisher over 40.

One of the oldest and most difficult marathons in the nation, the Heart of America will attract a relatively small but serious field of runners. If you're not planning on running it, consider working at it.

Joe also needs help for the Show-Me State Games 5K road race, to be held at 8 a.m., Sunday, Aug. 1.

To volunteer to work at either race, contact Joe at 445-2684.

Keep on runnin'

Just because it's getting hot doesn't mean it's time to quit running. You might want to slow down a bit during your training, of course, but if you want to race there are still several upcoming chances.

The CTC's biggie is the Heart of America Marathon, which will be Monday, Sept. 6 (see story on this page).

If a hot-weather marathon is more than you want to bite off, the CTC also has the Great Sandbagger 10K on Saturday, Aug. 7. Race director Roger Turnbough puts in this plug for that race:

`Have you always wanted to win a race, but your ability leaves you behind? Have you been passed by everyone except the race director? Have you arrived at the finish line only to find that your time was calculated using a calendar? Have I got the race for you.

`... This is the second-oldest race in Columbia. There have been more than 22 champions. The event is a 10K race with a staggered start....

``Pre-registration (July 15 through Aug. 1) is as simple as calling 445-1225 and leaving your name on my answering machine. Race-day signup is also available."

Non-CTC summer races include the Show-Me State Games 5K and track events, the Independence Day 5K in Moberly and, if you also can ride a bike, the Capital City Biathlon in Jefferson City.

The Show-Me Games road race and racewalk is Aug. 1, but runners must qualify at districts. The local qualifying is June 26 in Jefferson City. That also is the day of the Show-Me Games track qualifying at Jefferson City High School. The finals are July 23-24 (sub-masters) and July 25 (masters) at Lincoln University in Jefferson City. Call 882-2101 for more information.

The Independence Day 5K actually will be held Saturday, July 3, beginning at 8 a.m. It has an \$8.50 entry fee. The entry blank is enclosed.

The Capital City Biathlon, a charity event to benefit the March of Dimes, will begin at 8 a.m., Sunday, Aug. 22 at McClung Park in Jefferson City. It will consist of a 3-mile run, 20-mile bike and 3-mile run. Dick Hessler of the CTC was among 35,000 runners who competed in the Goteborg Varvet, a half-marathon in Goteberg, Sweden, on May 15. Hessler said he nearly collapsed after 12K on a 70-degree day, but he still finished 460th, which was the top 1.5 percent. His time was 1 hour, 23 minutes, 59 seconds after he had gone through 5K in 18:00 and 10K in 36:30. Dick reports that each runner got a commemorative medal and a bag of cookies at the finish line.

Todd Beaverson, a CTC member from Moberly, was an easy winner in the Anchorfest 5K on June 5 in Centralia. The 5K turned out to be more like 3 1/2 miles in this small, community race that started and ended in downtown Centralia. The race was part of the town's annual Anchor Festival.
