### Back to the beginning

#### May 9, 1970

Walk-Run Pentathlon: 1. Mark Achen, 1,705 points (decathlon-type scoring); 2. Joe Duncan, 1,544; 3. Whitney Hicks, 1,327; 4. Art Fleming, 1,101; 5. Don Granberg, 1,005; eight others. Achen won the 2-mile walk with 17:09 (Duncan, 17:37); Duncan won the 1-mile walk with 8:20 (Achen 8:23); Hicks won all three running events with 2:16 for the 880 (Granberg, 2:29), 11:14 for the 2-mile (Granberg, 11:29) and :28 for the 220 (Granberg, :30). Achen had 2:29, 13:05 and :28, and Duncan 2:36, 12:57 and :29.

#### May 23, 1970

Six-Mile Run: 1. Don Davidson, 33:28; 2. Dennis Stewart, 35:07; 3. Bob Brouillet, 36:15; 4. Don Granberg, 37:39; 5. Whitney Hicks, 38:39; 6. Joe Duncan, 40:11; 11 others. Dennis Stewart was a K.U. student, and this was his first CTC event. Even though Dennis (an 800-meter runner for K.U.) complained about the hills, he kept coming back fairly regularly for 15 years. Many of his CTC records for the shorter distances still stand.


